# EXPANDING OUR FOOTPRINT

## **COMMUNITY CLASSES**

Beginning August 2023, The Dubin Center is starting a pilot program offering educational classes and support groups to increase access for caregivers living outside Fort Myers.

The **Savuy Caregiver** course is a six-week class designed with evidence-based practice targeted at helping caregivers be more confident and prepared. The class is held in small groups where caregivers have the chance to meet and learn from other local caregivers and participate in interactive learning segments. Additionally, those participating in the class will receive a free book to go along with the course material.

# STRATEGIC PLANNING RETREAT

On August 4, 2023, the Dubin Center held a Strategic Planning Retreat. More than twenty stakeholders gathered to focus on advancing the center. Those in the room represented board members and the operational team led by the Executive Director. The energy in the room was palpable.

As the team kicked off and shared their "Why" around the room, many were moved to laughter and some tears. The deep personal



commitment to the cause, "Where no one faces dementia alone" is not a marketing slogan, it is a promise to the community.

The day began by level setting on the current state of operations and finances of the Dubin Center as well as a breakdown of talents and expertise represented by the Board and Council members. The second portion of the agenda included a facilitated activity. The team was led through a Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Threats (SWOT) exercise through the lens of their own experiences. Over 150 individual thoughts were collected and organized into areas of focus. Over the next quarter, these findings will feed into a Strategic Plan with goals and objectives to lead the Dubin Center team over the next three to five years and will be shared with the community.

# SPECIAL MEDICAL NEEDS SHELTER REGISTRATION

Hurricane season is among us in Southwest Florida. You need an updated emergency plan in place. The Dubin Center encourages all caregivers and persons living with dementia to register with the Special Medical Needs Program through Lee County Emergency Management. This program provides emergency shelter in the event of a hurricane for those with medical needs such as dementia, as well as anyone requiring electricity for medical needs such as oxygen machines, dialysis



treatments, or ventilators. Registration is free for all Lee County residents and transportation is available for those who do not have access to a vehicle in the event of an evacuation.

# It is important to note that caregivers are required to accompany a memory impaired person while staying at a special needs shelter.

Further, pets are allowed but are housed in different locations. Service animals are permitted to stay with owners.

Lee County Emergency Management will not process any applications if submitted within a 5-day hurricane window, so it is important to register as soon as possible. Applications must be renewed annually during each new hurricane season and can be completed via mail or online. The Dubin Center staff are here to assist anyone interested in applying.
